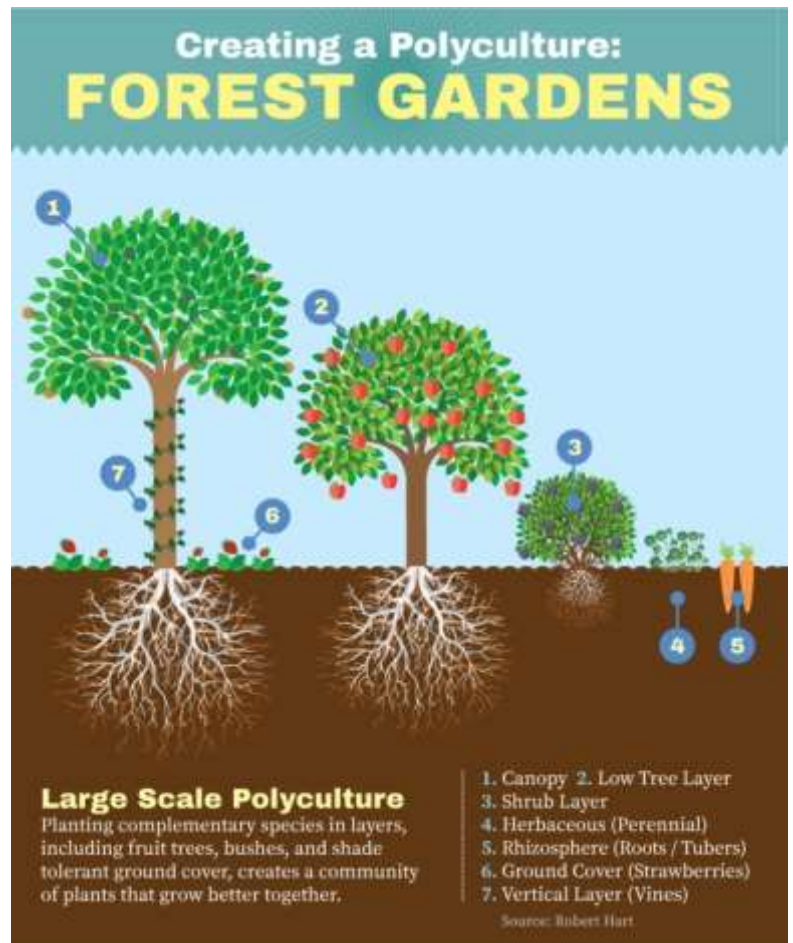

FOOD FORESTS

The Community Food Council and the Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation are teaming up to create food forests across the Del Norte and Adjacent Tribal Lands area.

This collaboration is funded by a \$400,000 USDA Community Food Project grant and a United Indian Health Services grant received by the Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation. The funding lasts for 4 years and will be used to create 4 new food forests and support numerous school and community gardens.
